Customs Single Window environment - Public Consultation

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1. Background

The purpose of the consultation is to gather businesses', individuals', and other interested parties' views about the formalities related the movement of goods across EU borders. It is part of a study for the Directorate-General for Taxation and Customs Union of the European Commission to provide evidence for a possible new initiative to develop an integrated and coherent electronic environment of single window services for customs. The 'single window' is a facility which allows parties involved in trade and transport to lodge standardised information and documents with a single entry-point to fulfil all import, export and transit-related regulatory requirements. For more information on the single window initiative see the European Commission's Customs dedicated site here.

More specifically, the consultation focuses on processes related to regulatory requirements from customs and other authorities (health, agriculture, environment, fisheries, etc.) that have to be fulfilled for the clearance of goods crossing the EU borders. The survey asks a few questions about your views of the current situation, priorities and expectations for future changes, as well as some profile questions to get an idea of who you are.

Once the consultation is closed, the results will feed into the preparatory work for a potential future initiative on an EU Single Window Environment for Customs. It is important to note that any initiative would be subject to approval of the new Commission. A summary of the responses to this consultation will be published on the website of the Commission Directorate-General for Taxation and Customs Union after the end of the consultation period.
