<u>Cumulation in the African, Caribbean and Pacific countries within Economic Partnership</u> Agreements with the European Union

Version 07.09.2023

The table below summarizes the current possibilities for <u>operators located in African, Caribbean and Pacific countries</u> ('the ACP countries') to apply cumulation when exporting to the EU under the framework of an Economic Partnership Agreement ('the EPA') between the EU and the ACP countries.

The table is based on the provisions related to cumulation under each EPA and on the notices published in the Official Journal (C Series) of the EU concerning cumulation, which remains the legal basis for the application of cumulation.

All the EPAs with ACP countries in force provide for cumulation in the ACP countries, whereby operators based on those countries can benefit from cumulation of materials and of working or processing carried out in the EU, in certain ACP countries and in the OCTs.

The said cumulation is subject to the fulfilment of the specific requirements provided for in the protocols on rules of origin of each EPA.

Notes

- Columns lists the ACP countries which enjoy an EPAs with EU;
- Rows indicates the countries or regions with whom the ACP countries may cumulate;
- " $\sqrt{}$ " indicates that cumulation with materials and with working or processing is possible;
- " $\sqrt{*}$ " indicates that only cumulation with materials is possible;
- (a) Cumulation is not allowed with materials listed in Annex X of Protocol 1 to the ESA-EU interim EPA:
- **(b)** Cumulation is not allowed with materials listed in Annex XII of Protocol 1 to the ESA-EU interim EPA;
- (c) Cumulation is not allowed with materials listed in Appendices 7, 8, 10 and 11 to Annex II of the Market Access Regulation Regulation (EU) 2016/1076;
- **(d)** To determine the origin of the products EU non-preferential rules apply; cumulation is not allowed with materials originating in countries where antidumping or countervailing measures; measures in place can be consulted in the <u>EC TARIC website</u>.
- (e) Cumulation is not allowed with materials originating in South Africa that cannot be imported into the EU duty-free quota-free, see Notice 2020/C 156/03¹
