



# BREXIT CHECKLIST FOR TRADERS

## ASSESS WHETHER YOUR BUSINESS TRADES WITH THE UK OR MOVES GOODS THROUGH THE UK

If it does:

<b>REGISTER</b> your business with the national customs authority to trade with non-EU countries, if you have not done so yet.
<b>ASSESS</b> whether your business has the necessary <b>resources and capacity</b> (staff, access to IT systems, storage) and holds all necessary <b>customs authorisations</b> to import or export.
<b>ASK</b> your national customs authority which existing customs <b>simplifications</b> and <b>facilitations</b> are available for your business, such as guarantees and transit simplifications.
<b>CONSIDER</b> applying for <b>Authorised Economic Operator</b> (AEO) status from your national customs authority.
<b>TALK</b> to your <b>business partners</b> (suppliers, intermediaries, carriers) as Brexit might also impact your supply chain.
