- The **revision** of the EU RTP for the **public sector** in terms of the suggested competency assortment along with the proficiency level (PL) recommendations.
- The EU RTP for the **private sector** specifically developed in response to 2019 EU Recognition pilot cycle feedback.

Overall, this document provides a <u>revision of selected sections</u> of document - RTP for Academic Customs Education (2016). It should not be read as standalone

document, but rather in parallel to the original documents that provide the context and background of this EU initiative.

A full revision of the EU RTP for Academic Customs Education (2016) will follow the overall future revision of the CustComp^{eu}.

2 Background of the revision

The EU Certificate of Recognition ran a first pilot year in 2018-19, during which the process methodology and accompanying documentation were evaluated in terms of quality, clarity and usability. Feedback from the pilot cycle was gathered from all stakeholders (applicants, Assessment Board, the EC) and thoroughly evaluated. The decision to proceed in revising sections of the existing RTP document have been based on the following findings:

1. The PL descriptions could not account for both Master's and Bachelor's qualifications, and the difference in the expected scope of each competency.

The present revision of PL descriptions assigns a different interpretation to PL depending on whether they are addressed by a Bachelor's (emphasis on conceptual processing, procedures, operations) or a Master's programme (emphasis on strategic context and the intra- and inter-organisational relationships).

2. In light of the extended PL descriptions (point above), the assignment of PL should be re-evaluated in all public sector RTPs.

The present RTP revision incorporates all necessary amendments to PLs for both Bachelor's and Master's programmes, and modules within.

3. The absence of an EU RTP for the private sector made it difficult for applying programmes that address private or public/private audiences to benchmark their academic programme content and understand and follow the application process. Moreover, it complicated the quantitative assessment process and made the application forms complex and loaded with instruction and information.

The development of the RTP for the private sector will help remove the excess information from the application form, thus making the forms simpler and much easier to fill in. Moreover, it helps establish greater transparency in the quantitative assessment phase.

3 The revised PL descriptions

A PL summarises the required level of proficiency for someone within a certain role. In combination with the competencies required for a certain role, it mirrors both the importance of the competency and the frequency of when it is required in the role.

Based on the CustComp^{eu} PL definitions, the following extended PL descriptions were devised to correspond to both the academic nature of the RTP, and the need for a different interpretation of levels as these correspond to Master's/Bachelor's degrees and the different nature of the competency areas (Operational competencies (OC), Professional competencies

(PC), Management competencies (MC)). As such, the revised PL descriptions (Annex 1: Revised Proficiency Level descriptions) summarise the following principles:

- For **OC** within a **Bachelor's** degree, emphasis is placed on conceptual processing, procedures and operations. Here, knowledge of the key Customs **concepts** the operational competency addresses is significant.
- For OC within a Master's degree, emphasis is placed on strategic context and the intra- and inter-organisational relationships. Here, knowledge of the Customs context the operational competency addresses is significant.
- For **PC** within both **Bachelor's** and **Master's** degrees, emphasis is placed on the existence of the key professional skills the competency addresses.
- For MC within both Bachelor's and Master's degrees, emphasis is placed on the
 existence of the key managerial ability the competency addresses.

4 The revised EU RTP for the public sector

The development of the public sector RTP for academic Customs education is intended to maximise the level of consistency in the coverage of the learning topics and learning outcomes of similar Customs-related training programmes. This includes Master's and Bachelor's programmes throughout Europe. It is specifically targeted at Customs-specific knowledge and skills.

The EU RTP explained below is developed to provide a suggested way of organising or delivering different types of study programmes. This implies that academic studies providers or developers can opt to deliver the Master's or Bachelor programme on different ways.

To aid the EU Customs Certificate of Recognition process, the following revisions were developed.

4.1.1 Revised public sector EU RTP for a Customs Master's programme

As a benchmark for all Customs Master's programmes that apply for an EC Certificate of Recognition, the following overview is provided. In the table below, reference is made to the competencies that are crucial for participants pursuing a Customs Master's programme. The benchmark is based on the competency profile of a mid to senior manager in a Customs Administration. Additionally, the required PC and MC that are most suited in an academic context are added, with a strong emphasis on the Management Competency Profile, since PC are expected to have developed during previous study and/or working experience. Based on the defined target audience, the PL per competencies are determined.

It is important to note that **PC and MC**, such as *Knowledge/Experience Sharing* and/or *Technological Ability* do not require training through dedicated courses. They can be trained via a group working paper, thesis or transfer project.

This reference table will be used as a benchmark for the assessment of Customs Master's Study programmes throughout the EU when seeking EC recognition. The competencies of the applying academic programme should be aligned with the competencies of the appropriate RTP. In addition, the learning outcomes should be in line with the learning outcomes related to these competencies in the EU Customs Training Curriculum. For more detail on the

learning outcomes associated with the competencies of the RTP, please consult the *EU Customs Training Curriculum for the Public Sector* [R01]. If, based on the target audience, specific competencies are substituted with competencies from the *EU Competency Framework for the Private Sector* [R02], please consult the *EU Customs Training Curriculum for the Private Sector* [R03] for their associated learning outcomes.

Overall, to meet Criterion 3 (in line with the RTP at least 75%) of the EU Customs Recognition process, Master's Academic programmes need to demonstrate they address a **minimum of 32 RTP competencies** (from either the public and/or private sector RTP) at the suggested PL indication, of which:

- 18 OC (out of a total of 21)
- 9 MC (out of a total of 11) and
- 5 PC (out of a total of 10)

In addition, the learning outcomes should be in line with the learning outcomes related to these competencies in the EU Customs Training Curriculum. The development of the private sector RTP for academic Customs education is intended to maximise the level of consistency in the coverage of the learning topics and learning outcomes of similar Customs-related training programmes. This includes Master's and Bachelor's programmes throughout Europe. It is specifically targeted at Customs-specific knowledge and skills.

It is important to note that the private and public RTP are different only in terms of the Operational Competency requirements for each academic degree and are identical in their requirements of PC and MC (where relevant).

To aid the EU Customs Certificate of Recognition process, the following RTP for the private sector were developed.

It is important to note that **PC and MC**, such as Time Management or Teamwork, do not require training through dedicated courses. They can be trained via a group working paper, thesis or transfer project.

This reference table will be used as a benchmark for the assessment of Customs Bachelor's Study programmes throughout the EU when seeking EC recognition. The competencies of the applying academic programme should be aligned with the competencies of the appropriate RTP. In addition, the learning outcomes should be in line with the learning outcomes related to these competencies in the EU Customs Training Curriculum. Overall, to meet Criterion 3 (in line with the RTP at least 75%) of the EU Customs Recognition process, Bachelor's Academic programmes need to demonstrate they address a **minimum of 23 RTP competencies** (from either the public and/or private sector RTP) at the suggested PL indication, of which:

- 18 OC (out of a total of 21) and
- 5 PC (out of a total of 9)
