

Eurodad is a network of 60 non-governmental organisations (NGOs) from 28 European countries working on issues related to development finance, inequality and poverty reduction. Eurodad's aims are to:

- ➤ Push for development policies that support pro-poor and democratically-defined sustainable development strategies;
- > Support the empowerment of Southern people to chart their own path towards development and ending poverty;
- > Seek a lasting and sustainable solution to the debt crisis, appropriate development financing, and a stable international financial system conducive to development.

Taxation is an essential source of financing for development and tax justice is therefore a key focus area for Eurodad. The central concern of Eurodad is the impacts that policies and standards have on the world's poorest and most vulnerable people.

In its work, Eurodad builds on the insights and experiences of its broad network of members and Southern allies. Eurodad coordinates the campaign and advocacy work of non-governmental organisations working on tax issues, including through the civil society network Tax Justice Europe. Eurodad is also a part of the global coordination committee of the Global Alliance for Tax Justice.

Southern networks with which Eurodad works very closely with include Tax Justice Network Africa, as well as Eurodad's sister-networks the Asian People's Movement on Debt and Development (APMDD), the African Forum and Network on Debt and Development (AFRODAD), and Red Latinoamericana por Justicia Económica y Social (LATINDADD).

Eurodad has established a strong expertise on tax justice and carry out in-depth research and analysis on issues such as tax treaties, tax incentives and international tax governance and standards. The organisation has published several agenda-setting reports and briefings, including, for example, a Proposal for a UN Convention on Tax (2022) and Make Polluters Pay – How to Tax Excessive Ecological Footprints (2024).

Together with its members and allies, Eurodad closely monitors and engages with international tax related processes in a number of international institutions, including the EU institutions, the United Nations, the World Bank, International Monetary Fund and the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development.

Eurodad has existed since 1990 and is registered as a non-profit organisation in both the Netherlands and Belgium.
